


CUPBOARD LOVE

Flex your storage needs with Nicola Harding's clever cabinet that can turn its hand to any occasion, or rather room. Called Clobber, the freestanding piece can be adapted for use in the kitchen, bedroom or anywhere your storage requirements demand. 'We have long-needed a fail-safe freestanding cupboard that we can adapt as a wardrobe, larder or housekeeper's cupboard and this is the very thing,' says Nicola. Sold via her homeware brand NiX by Nicola Harding, Clobber costs from £3,995 and can be fitted out with your choice of hanging rails, drawers and shelves.



TWICE AS GOOD

Doubling down on the success of its Tangram collection by Garcia Cumini, Cesar has introduced two new surface options, and they don't disappoint. First up is Groove, a timber door with deep grooves that conceal the handles for an uninterrupted, modular look. Then there's Nuance, a glass worktop that can be frosted or polished and comes in four colours. Pitted together, as on this island, the effect is nothing short of sublime. Launched at interior design show Decorex, Turnstyle Designs' new brutalist-inspired cabinet hardware has a powerful, blocky, architectural edge. We're smitten by this option with crisp diamond grip detailing. Influenced by the strong, monolithic shapes of architect Denys Lasdun's work, the Plinth range features door levers, cabinet pulls and cabinet handles in more than 240 finish combinations, including the company's signature hand-stitched Italian saddle leather.
